KEY

Plants are found in these types of landscape, but they CAN grow happily elsewhere.

D - Dry. Plants most capable of surviving very dry conditions

U - Upper forest. Above 350m altitude

W - Woodland. Trees are smaller, further apart and closer to plains

A - Alpine. Above 1500m altitude

F - Forest. Trees are taller, closer together & closer to mountains
